Program Information

- ❖ Possess a High School Diploma
- ❖ At least 5 years of related experience
- ❖ A degree in a related field may be substituted for experience*
- ❖ Two professional endorsements
- ❖ Application fee: \$150
- ❖ Applicants must take a 3.5 hour written, open “blue book” exam and earn a score of 75 or higher
- ❖ Exam fee: \$100 and an annual renewal fee of \$100
- ❖ 12 Professional Development Hours (PDH) are required for certification holders per year
